

A Guide to Housing Associations in North Hertfordshire

What is a housing association?

Housing associations are independent, not-for-profit, social landlords. They provide and manage affordable housing to meet local needs in the areas they serve, working closely with local councils and others to do this.

Housing associations traditionally provide affordable rented accommodation. Increasingly, they are also providing shared ownership properties, which enable individuals to buy a share of the property and pay rent on the remaining share they do not own.

Accommodation is provided for a wide range of housing needs. Housing associations provide homes for single people, couples and families, as well as sheltered accommodation for the elderly and housing for people with special needs. Some housing associations specialise in providing housing for specific groups of people, such as single people or people with special needs. All housing associations are regulated by a government body called the Housing Corporation.

What is a housing association tenancy?

Housing associations provide homes which are, largely, affordable, permanent and secure. Housing association tenancies are called '*assured tenancies*' and provide tenants with the right to:

- live in their home as long as they observe the conditions of their tenancy agreement;
- have repairs carried out to their home; and
- pass their tenancy on to a spouse after they die.

In some circumstances, tenants may also be eligible for the *Right to Acquire* scheme which gives tenants the right to buy at a discount the home they currently rent. Housing association tenants can apply to the Council for Housing Benefit to help with their rent in the same way that private tenants can.

How can I apply for a housing association property?

If you want housing association accommodation, you will have to apply to go on a waiting list. Some housing associations operate their own waiting lists and accept direct applications for housing. You may find that such housing associations will occasionally close their waiting list to keep waiting times manageable. You will need to contact the housing association direct in order to apply.

However, many housing associations will now only allocate properties to people who are put forward (or 'nominated') by the Council. You will have to be registered on the Council's Housing Register (waiting list) in order to be nominated for a housing association home.

About this guide

This guide contains summary information about housing associations which have properties in North Hertfordshire. It includes contact details and information on the number and type of properties the housing associations manage and the groups of people they cater for. Please note that this information has been supplied to the Council by each housing association and was correct at the time of going to press.
