LEGAL AND COMMUNITY SAFEGUARDING

MEMBERS INFORMATION NOTE

Safeguarding Training

Safeguarding relates to the action taken to promote the welfare of children and adults at risk and protect them from harm.

Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility and all NHC employees, volunteers and members have a duty to take action to safeguard children and adults at risk in our communities.

NHC offers two levels of training and the level of training required is determined by how much contact, be that direct or indirect (email, telephone, post etc.) you have with children and adults including access to personal and sensitive information about them.

The levels of training are:

Basic

- a 3-hour long course which is required to refresh every 3 years.
- This is for any member that has contact, either directly or indirect with children and adults and/or access to personal and sensitive information.
- There are separate basic courses for children and adults at risk.

Advanced

- a 6-hour course which is required to be refreshed every 3 years.
- This is for any member who manages another member or is a Designated Safeguarding Officer.
- There are separate advanced courses for children and adults at risk.



The concern for welfare element (Phase 1) The Right Care Right Person (RCRP) went live on 2nd April 2024:

- Police call handlers, who answer 101 and 999 calls, have received enhanced training to make decisions about the response to these calls.
- Every concern for welfare call will be individually assessed.
- Where police decide not to attend, an explanation will be provided to the caller.
- There is an agreed escalation process in place should a stakeholder be unhappy with a decision by the police.
- Extensive engagement with partner agencies ahead of going live and initially there will be daily meetings with partners following go live to allow any issues to be raised and quickly addressed.

1. DECISION TAKEN

To approve the updated Forums name to 'Community' Forums and *to note* the administrative changes to section 8 to reflect the name changes to certain wards and membership numbers per Forum, as per Appendix A (as shown as tracked changes).

2. DECISION TAKER

The Leader, Cllr Elizabeth Denis in consultation with Jeanette Thompson, Service Director, Legal & Community.

3. DATE DECISION TAKEN:

1 May 2024

4. REASON FOR DECISION

4.1 To update to reflect a request following Chair and Vice Chair Forum discussions for a more inclusive title of 'Community' Forum (the remainder is not a decision – as it falls into the category of administrative accuracy).

5. ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED

- 5.1. To retain the current title of 'Area Forums' until the Constitutional Review is undertaken, and reported through to Council in the autumn of 2024 (for implementation in 2025).
- 5.2. However, given the overall feedback from the Chairs, Vice Chairs and Executive Member for Community & Partnerships, and the fact that administrative changes were required before the new municipal year, the new title for the 'Community' Forums was considered appropriate and approved.

6. CONSULTATION (INCLUDING THE EFFECT ON STAKEHOLDERS, PARTNERS, AND THE PUBLIC)

6.1. An informal 'year' end discussion was undertaken with the Chairs and Vice Chairs of the Area Forums in April, with the Executive Member for Community & Partnerships. Whilst some of the procedures and processes are yet to be considered as part of the Constitutional/ Forum review, one regarding an aspiration to increase community involvement was expressed, and the perception that 'Community Forum' as opposed to 'Area Forum' may lead to better understanding and involvement of North Herts residents. This name change has therefore been taken forward at this stage, in advance of the new municipal year, to encourage such involvement and to ensure consistency throughout 2024/25. The Deputy Leader was part of that aforementioned discussion, and has also been notified of this decision.

7. FORWARD PLAN

7.1 This decision is not a key Executive decision and has therefore not been referred to in the Forward Plan.

8. BACKGROUND/ RELEVANT CONSIDERATIONS

- 8.1. Regarding the name change see 6.1 above.
- 8.2. A calendar of meetings will need to be approved by Full Council at its Annual meeting in May. To ensure consistency of name throughout that municipal year, it was considered appropriate to make that change in advance of such a meeting. This also means that this can be reflected in the Council's meeting case management system Mod.gov, and relevant Community & Partnership officers can publicise the newly titled Forum meetings appropriately.

9. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 9.1. The Area Forums are informal bodies without decision making powers, and the Terms of Reference can be amended by Leader, or executive/ officer as per the report to Council 14 April 2023. As per 14.6.16.1 of the Constitution, the scope of the Leader's responsibilities spans all Portfolios, ensuring co-ordination and a coherent approach to the Council's decision making. The Leader can make any decision which is delegated to any Executive Member. In discharging this particular decision, the Leader is exercising her overall specific responsibility for strategic decision making, following cross party issues raised with the Leader, and does so under section 14.6.16.5 of the Constitution. The relevant Executive Member with responsibility for Community & Partnerships had also requested this name change.
- 9.2. The Service Director: Legal & Community has delegations under 14.6.9(a): (v). To authorise changes to the Governance Policies/ Protocols/ Codes or Guidance (as the case may be) that fall within the remit of the Monitoring Officer and/ or Legal Services (and are not already covered by 14.6.9 to reflect decisions of the Council / Committees and the Cabinet, or minor ones relating to changes of fact and law, or if required for practical purposes, in order to ensure the proper administration of the Council, subject to regular notification to all Members of such changes. The Service Director concerned also has responsibility for Community & Partnerships and was therefore consulted.
- 9.3. The North Hertfordshire (Electoral Changes) Order 2023 No 1024, created 25 wards some with differing names to those previously set out under the areas listed in section 9.8 of Appendix A. This Order also increased the number of Councillors from 49 to 51 and this needs to be reflected in the relevant section cited.
