Elections Act 2022, Tranche 2 measures

Changes to Absent Voting

This briefing note is to inform Members that Tranche 2 measures of the Elections Act 2022 come into effect from **Tuesday 31 October 2023**. We have produced the below summary of the changes for your information:

Changes to postal and proxy voting:

1. Identity checking requirements

- All absent vote applications (except for emergency proxy applications) made on or after 31 October 2023 must contain a National Insurance Number (NINo) or a reason why one cannot be provided.
- The personal identifiers contained on the application (name, address, date of birth and NINo) must initially be verified against Department of Works and Pension (DWP) data
- Where an application fails to match with DWP data electors will be required to provide **documentary evidence** to verify their identity. Where this is not possible, electors must submit an **attestation** to confirm their identity.

2. Online absent vote applications

- From 31 October 2023, electors (except for anonymous electors) will be able to apply for most types of **absent vote online** via the GOV UK website, in a similar fashion to registering to vote. We will also include a link to this on our website.
- Electors can apply for the following absent votes both online and through a paper application:
 - Postal vote
 - o Proxy vote for a particular election or referendum
 - Proxy application for definite or indefinite period for overseas and service electors
- Electors will not be able to apply for the following absent votes online but can continue to be applied for through a paper application:
 - o Proxy postal application
 - o Proxy application for definite or indefinite period due to disability
 - Proxy application for definite or indefinite period due to employment, service etc.
 - o Emergency proxy application

3. Maximum period for absent vote applications

- From 31 October 2023, a **postal vote** can be in place for:
 - o a particular poll (poll held on specific date)
 - o a definite period of not more than 3 years
 - o a maximum period of up to 3 years

- Electors applying for a postal vote from 31 October 2023 onwards will only be able to hold their postal vote until the third 31 January following the date on which their application was granted. Different rules will apply to overseas electors – for further information on how these changes impact overseas electors please contact the elections team via email: elections@north-herts.gov.uk
- For electors with a long-term postal vote (in place before 31 October 2023) there will be transitional arrangements. Existing domestic electors will be able to vote by post for relevant polls until 31 January 2026.
- Proxy voters can continue to put in place a proxy arrangement for an indefinite period (subject to a three yearly eligibility check and five yearly signature refresh). However, all existing proxy voters who have an arrangement in place before 31 October 2023 must reapply and make a fresh application by 31 January 2024. We intend to send out a notice to existing proxy voters informing them of the need to reapply in early December.

4. Changes to proxy voting limits

- The number of people a person can act as proxy for has also been restricted.
- From 31 October 2023, a person is not entitled to vote as proxy in any electoral area on behalf of more than four electors. Within the four electors, no more than two electors can be domestic electors (i.e. neither service voters nor overseas electors)
- In the event of any by-elections whose notice of election is published from 31 October 2023 to 30 January 2024 transitional provisions will be in place. Further information will be provided to candidates should this scenario arise.

5. What does this mean for you?

- For future election campaigns, we would encourage you to direct electors to the online absent vote website to apply for a postal vote - rather than providing them with a paper application. This web link could also be included in any campaign literature you send out.
- As absent vote application forms are not prescribed, political parties can continue to create their own forms for electors if they wish. However, you must ensure any forms provided from 31 October 2023 contain all the newly required information. For postal vote applications this includes:
 - Need for the NINo or reason it cannot be provided
 - Whether request is for a particular poll, a definite period that does not exceed
 3 years or for the maximum period of up to 3 years.
- Online postal vote applications allow electors to supply their previous name if they
 wish to help with DWP matching. While it is not a legal requirement for paper
 applications, it would be helpful to include this to allow for more efficient processing.
- We will be issuing a further briefing note in due course outlining the changes to postal vote handling that take effect for polls taking place on or after 2 May 2024.

Who can vote in the BID Ballot?

Persons eligible to vote in the ballot will be the non-domestic ratepayer listed on the Council's database for each hereditament (business premise) situated in the geographical area of the proposed BID as at the date of this Notice. Each person entitled to vote in this ballot shall have one vote in respect of each hereditament occupied or (if unoccupied) owned by them in the geographical area of the proposed BID.

Appointment of a Proxy

Persons eligible to vote in the BID ballot may appoint someone else to vote on their behalf (for example, if they are going to be away at the time of the ballot). Applications to appoint a proxy must be submitted to Civica Election Services (CES) at the above address no later than **5pm** on **Monday 27 November 2023**. An application for the appointment of a proxy must be made in writing and:

- a) state the full name and address of the person whom the person entitled to vote (the applicant) wishes to appoint as a proxy;
- b) state the address(es) of the applicant's hereditament or hereditaments;
- c) be signed by the applicant; and
- d) contain a statement by the applicant that the proxy so named has been consulted and is capable and willing to be appointed.

A proxy appointment may be cancelled by notifying CES at the above address no later than **5pm** on **Saturday 2 December 2023**.

Lost Ballot Papers

Ballot Papers will be despatched on **Tuesday 7 November 2023**. If you have not received your ballot paper in the week after this date, please apply for a replacement ballot paper.

CES can provide a replacement request form to aid the process of requesting a replacement and providing all the necessary information. Please email **bids@cesvotes.com** to request one.

You may apply to CES for a replacement paper by supplying **ONE** of the following:

- a) An email sent from a business account including a company email signature; or
- b) A letter in hard copy form along with the appropriate 'evidence of identity'; or
- c) A scan of both the letter and the 'evidence of identity' attached to an email

Any email requests should be sent to **bids@cesvotes.com**. Hard Copy requests should be addressed to The Independent Scrutineer, Civica Election Services, The Election Centre, 33 Clarendon Road, London N8 0NW.

Hard copy requests must be signed by the Eligible Voter and evidence of the voter's identity must be provided in the form of **ONE** of the following:

- a) A signed **Letterhead** for the appropriate company; or
- b) A signed photocopy of the National Non-Domestic Rating Bill for the hereditament; or
- c) A signed **photocopy** of an item of personal ID such as a **Passport** or **Driving Licence**.

Please do not send original copies of ID or Bills.

CES will issue any replacements that match the requirements detailed above, from the replacement deadline on **Friday 1 December 2023**.

Spoilt Ballot Papers

If you inadvertently spoil your ballot paper in such a manner that it cannot be conveniently used as a ballot paper, please return it to CES (address overleaf). On receipt of the spoilt ballot paper, CES will issue a replacement. No replacements can be issued if the spoilt ballot paper is received by CES later than three working days before the day of the ballot.

Count of Ballot Papers

Ballot papers will be counted on **Friday 8 December 2023**, and the result of the ballot will be announced shortly after.

For a BID ballot to be successful there must be a majority of those voting in favour of the proposal, and those voting in favour must represent a majority of the aggregate rateable value of the hereditaments voting.

Rejected Ballot Papers

If a ballot paper is duplicated and two are returned bearing the same number or barcode both will be void and not counted. Any ballot papers that are returned unsigned, unmarked or that are void for uncertainty will also be void and not counted.

Declaring the result

The ballot result will declare:

- a) the total number of valid votes cast:
- b) the total aggregate rateable value of valid votes cast;
- c) the total number of valid votes cast in favour of the BID;
- d) the total aggregate rateable value of valid votes in favour of the BID; and
- e) if applicable, the total number of ballot papers rejected.

For the BID Ballot to be successful there must be:

- i. A majority in favour of the BID in the number of those voting; and
- ii. A majority in favour of the BID in the proportion of rateable value of those voting.

NATIONAL UPDATE


On Tuesday 19 September 2023, the Online Safety Bill passed its final Parliamentary debate, which means it is now soon to become law.

The Bill includes new laws to decisively tackle online violence against women and girls; making it easier to convict someone who shares intimate images without consent. Those found guilty could receive a maximum penalty of 6 months in custody.

We also have continued to run self defence classes in our refuge to our residents, which supports with wellbeing as well as physical health.



RECORD OF DECISION MADE UNDER DELEGATED AUTHORITY

1. DECISION TAKEN

To consider the results of a public consultation and set the council's taxi fare tariff for all taxi journeys starting and ending in North Hertfordshire. With effect from 6 November 2023, the new tariff will be:

TARIFF 1 (Standard Tariff)

| £3.50 | for the first 1,000 | yards or part thereof |

or part thereof (waiting time)

2. DECISION TAKER

Cllr Sean Prendergast, Executive Member for Housing and Environmental Health

3. DATE DECISION TAKEN

26 October 2023

4. REASON FOR DECISION

- 4.1 The Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 allows local authorities to regulate the maximum tariff charged by taxis. Whilst there is no fixed period for a tariff to remain in effect, the council has historically reviewed its tariff annually with the new tariff (where applicable) taking effect around November.
- 4.2 Taxi fares were last increased in 2022 and the taxi trade has asked the council for an increase to cover the increased cost of living, particularly fuel prices.
- 4.3 The adopted taxi tariff is as advertised during the consultation period without the mandatory discount proposed for vulnerable persons.

5. ALTERNATIVE OPTIONS CONSIDERED

5.1 No other options were considered as the decision is supported by the trade association representing the drivers and there was no public objection to the proposal.

6. CONSULTATION (INCLUDING THE EFFECT ON STAKEHOLDERS, PARTNERS AND THE PUBLIC)

- 6.1 The consultation process is defined within section 65 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 and has been followed.
- 6.2 Prior to the formal consultation process, the Executive Member and Deputy Executive Member met with the trade association and invited them to submit their proposal for 2023/24.
- 6.3 Having considered the National Fare League Tables, cost of motoring statistics from the AA/RAC, and the impact on residents, the Executive Member made a small adjustment to shorter fare costs to protect the most vulnerable in society who are reliant on taxis for essential short journeys.
- 6.4 In accordance with the prescribed process, the proposal was advertised in The Comet and The Royston Crow setting out how representations could be made and the process that would be followed. A separate webpage was created outlining the consultation and a number of social media posts referring to the consultation were posted periodically by the communications team.
- 6.5 Only one public consultation response was received, and the trade association supported the proposed fares.

7. FORWARD PLAN

7.1 This decision is not a key Executive decision and has therefore not been referred to in the Forward Plan.

8. RELEVANT CONSIDERATIONS

- 8.1 It has always been the council's position that the taxi tariff should be suitably placed in the National League Tables of Fares to reflect the high standards of vehicles and drivers required by the council and the local economic position compared to other areas of the country. Consideration is also given to ensuring that the position in the National Tables is comparable to other Hertfordshire authorities and neighbouring authorities.
- 8.2 North Herts have ordinarily been positioned in the top quartile in the fares league tables. The new tariff will position North Herts at joint 70th out of 340 authorities in the league tables.
- 8.3 Drivers have stated that there was a need for a decrease in the yardage for the initial flag rate to ensure that shorter journeys, that form a significant portion of business, receive a reasonable increase.
- 8.4 This has to be balanced against ensuring that any increase will not preclude the most vulnerable from accessing taxis for essential short journeys such as shopping, medical appointments, or socialisation.

9. LEGAL IMPLICATIONS

- 9.1 Section 65 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 sets out the prescribed process to be followed when amending a taxi tariff.
- 9.2 The power to set fares is an executive decision however has not been reserved for the Cabinet and has been delegated to the Executive Member Housing and Environmental Health under section 14.6.8 (b) (xiii) of the Constitution.
- 9.3 The Service Director Legal and Community has been consulted throughout the process, considered and reviewed the legalities and endorsed the decision.
- 9.4 The Council should give adequate weight to the consultation responses as required by section 65 (4) of the 1976 Act. Given that there is a majority of the trade against the proposal to introduce mandatory discounts (100% of the trade who responded with over 50% of the trade participation), and no appreciable support for the scheme from the public, the decision taken is a reasonable reflection of the legal requirements.
- 9.5 Best Practice Taxi and Private Hire Licensing Guidance issued by the Department for Transport states the fares set should be clear, understandable and balance the needs to the travelling public as against the ability for the trade to earn a living. The decision taken reflects those requirements.

10. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

10.1 Licensing case law has clarified the legislative position that councils can recover their reasonable costs of administration and enforcement through licensing fees therefore there is no cost to the Council from this consultation process.

11. RISK IMPLICATIONS

11.1 There is a risk that the trade challenge the decision of the council through the courts which can only be by way of Judicial Review. The decision would have to be shown to be unlawful or unreasonable for a challenge to be successful. The correct legal process has been followed and the decision is reasonable based on all available evidence provided by officers and by the trade.

12. EQUALITIES IMPLICATIONS

- 12.1 In line with the Public Sector Equality Duty, public bodies must, in the exercise of their functions, give due regard to the need to eliminate discrimination, harassment, victimisation, to advance equality of opportunity and foster good relations between those who share a protected characteristic and those who do not.
- 12.2 The discount scheme would potentially have provided some positive benefits to a group with a protected characteristic (disability). However, as indicated there were only 5 public responses received, and none apparently in support of the proposal. The Council, will, however, as indicated, be looking at voucher schemes to see whether this would be feasible in the future.

13. SOCIAL VALUE IMPLICATIONS

13.1 The Social Value Act and "go local" policy do not apply to this decision.

14. ENVIRONMENTAL IMPLICATIONS

14.1. There are no known Environmental impacts or requirements that apply to this decision.

15. HUMAN RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS

- 15.1 There are no additional resourcing implications as a result of this decision.

Are you recycling paper properly?

North and East Herts Councils are encouraging residents to do their bit to help the environment and keep service costs down by separating their paper from their mixed recyclables and general waste.

Recycling paper correctly uses much less energy than making paper from scratch. By following the council's 'Recycle Right' guidelines and keeping paper separate in your (blue) paper recycling box and free from contamination, it is more easily turned into new products, which in turn helps reduce the cost of providing these services to residents.

In 2022/23, North Herts and East Herts residents recycled 2,084 tonnes of paper. Despite these efforts, a substantial amount of paper is being put in refuse bins or the (purple) mixed recycling bin.

Paper – such as magazines, brochures, catalogues, newspapers, printer paper and white envelopes (even with windows) – is loaded into its own compartment in our recycling vehicles and transported to Palm Recycling who turn it into newsprint and other paper products.

Cllr Amy Allen, Executive Member for Recycling & Waste, said: "Recycling your paper separately is really easy and important. We're asking residents to check their paper recycling habits and use a separate box, which in return we'll get money to put back into the service, keeping the costs down. Plus you'll have more room in your recycling bin for cardboard, plastic bottles, pots, tubs and trays, tins, cans, and glass.

"So please dig out your blue box or order one online or give us a call. We all need to do our bit for the environment and recycling more of our household waste in the right way is an easy starting point."

Top tips for recycling paper in your (blue) kerbside box:

- Keep your paper separate there's no need to put your box out for every collection if it isn't full.
- Keep it dry no need to put your box out if it's raining, save it for another collection.
- Please prevent litter put shredded paper in a paper bag in your box and avoid putting your box out on a windy day.
- Please put brown envelopes (even with windows) with cardboard in your mixed recycling bin.

Statement on London Luton Airport expansion

Leader of the Council, Elizabeth Dennis said: "We are deeply disappointed by the decision of the Secretaries of State for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities, and the Under Secretary of State at the Department for Transport, to expand the current capacity of London Luton Airport from 18 to 19 million passengers per annum (mppa). This decision flies in the face of public opposition, and completely ignores the climate emergency.

"We remain very concerned at the further expansion of the airport, giving rise to greater carbon emissions, noise, air pollution and traffic congestion. We are not persuaded that the mitigations proposed are adequate or sufficient to meet our climate responsibilities, and our offer to codesign solutions with Luton remains open. Together with Hertfordshire County Council and our neighbouring authorities, we continue to oppose the further expansion of the airport to 32 mppa through the ongoing examination process."
