WASTE AND STREET CLEANSING SERVICE STRIKE ACTION

East and North Herts Councils have been advised that GMB Union members working for the councils' contractor Urbaser, have voted in favour of strike action. The strike action will only be taken by staff employed by Urbaser, the councils' waste and street cleansing contractor.

We are obviously disappointed that the union and Urbaser have not been able to agree an amicable resolution and that this is likely to result in strike action. We are aware that industrial action is likely to begin on 29 November 2023. We have not officially been informed of the duration of the action, but it has the potential to be prolonged and, if so, will result in disruption to our services. We appreciate that this will be frustrating for our residents, but as this matter is between staff and their employer, Urbaser, the Councils will not involve themselves in negotiations.

It is unclear how many staff will take part in industrial action and consequently the full impacts are unclear.

At this stage, our advice to residents will be to continue to place their containers out for collection. We will be able to provide generic information regarding the disruption but will not be in a position to answer individual enquiries or complaints regarding missed collections.

The councils will continue to make it clear that the current negotiations over pay and conditions are between Urbaser and its directly employed staff. We will publish a short set of FAQs on our websites, focused on how residents can manage their waste if they do not receive collections.

The current contract with Urbaser to deliver waste and recycling services for East and North Herts runs until May 2025. The council will not discuss the contractual relationship with Urbaser in the public domain.

Officers will closely monitor the service provision during the industrial action but will be unable to respond to contacts from members of the public about specific failures in service due to the volume of contacts that the Councils anticipate during any strike period. Officers will be liaising with customer service and communications teams to ensure information is provided upfront to residents, to help manage expectations. We would like to remind members that liaising directly with the union may undermine the negotiations and negatively impact on the Councils' contractual position. If you are approached by a member of the Urbaser staff or the union, please direct the correspondence to the communications team.

At this time our official statement is, "We cannot be involved in pay negotiations between Urbaser and the GMB Union, however we fully understand residents' concern about the proposed strike action and will aim to keep them informed, where possible, on any disruption to waste and recycling collections."

4 CHAIR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

- (2) Members were reminded that this Council had declared a Climate Emergency. This was a serious decision and meant that, as this was an emergency, all of us, officers and Members had that in mind as we carried out our various roles and tasks for the benefit of our District.
- (3) The Chair drew attention to the item on the agenda front pages regarding Declarations of Interest and reminded Members that, in line with the Code of Conduct, any Declarations of Interest needed to be declared immediately prior to the item in question.
- (4) The Chair advised for the purposes of clarification that 4.8.23(a) of the Constitution did not apply to this meeting.
- (5) The Chair advised of a change in the order of the agenda. The referrals from the Overview and Scrutiny Committee on Waste, Recycling and Street Cleansing Design would be considered first, followed by Agenda Item 12 'Waste, Recycling and Street Cleansing Service Design Part 1'. Subject to the discussion and resolution on Agenda Item 12, the Chair advised that Agenda Items 10 and 11 may not be required and deferred to a future meeting.

5 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

6 ITEMS REFERRED FROM OTHER COMMITTEES

The Chair invited Councillor Sean Nolan to present the Overview and Scrutiny Referrals on the 'Waste, Recycling and Street Cleansing Service Design'.

12 WASTE, RECYCLING AND STREET CLEANSING SERVICE DESIGN - PART 1

RESOLVED:

- (1) That any changes to the service design identified in paragraph 8.2 of the part 1 report (and Appendix 2 of the part 2 report) regarding waste and recycling service would be referred back to Cabinet for approval.
- (2) That any changes to the service design identified in paragraph 8.2 of the part 1 report (and Appendix 2 of the part 2 report) regarding street cleansing service would be referred back to Cabinet for approval.

7 ALLOCATION OF (ADDITIONAL) HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION GRANT

RESOLVED: That Cabinet:

- (1) Approved the allocation £192k of HPG in order to fund the salary budget shortfall in the housing team to March 2027.
- (2) Authorised the remaining amount (of £7.9k) to be used to offset the cost of hotel placements, which are anticipated to grow further over the winter months.

Jemma Larkin said: "The shop opening was more than I could have wished for. Hitchin certainly welcomed us with open arms! The feedback has been really positive with lots of shoppers commenting on how lovely it is to be able to find and support so many talented small businesses under one roof.

"I set up "Shop Small Hitchin" markets as I wanted somewhere to show my own small business, The Furniture Parlour, and as many others as possible. My business is based around sustainability and saving furniture from landfill. I have a studio on Bury Mead Road where I paint, take commissions, run workshops and stock Annie Sloan paint. I now run the markets 3 times a year at Hitchin Town Hall, with the next one taking place on the 25 & 26 November where you will find over 90 small, creative businesses. Growing into a shop space felt like the perfect way to give some of these businesses some exposure over the festive period while filling an empty shop, hopefully benefiting the area and existing local businesses close by."

Cllr Keith Hoskins, North Herts Council's Executive Member for Enterprise and Arts, attended a preview evening on Wednesday 8 November, and said: "I am delighted to see such enthusiasm from artisans and businesses coming forward to set up in the Churchgate

area of Hitchin. This is a brilliant initiative on so many levels, bringing more choice to Christmas shopping, reusing empty shops and supporting local businesses that are just setting up, or getting ready to expand."
