Community & Partnerships Executive Member briefing – December 2023

Community & Licensing

Community Safety

- The ASB injunction that was due to be heard on 22nd November 2023 was adjourned, due to no judge being available, until 14th February 2024. The interim injunction was extended until that date. This injunction has contributed to the drop in ASB cases reported to police.
- NHC CSP have been able to secure in excess of 50 vouchers for the HollieGuard app. This is an app that promotes women's safety and usually costs £80 annually. The vouchers have been issued to North Herts college students, who are taking the Uniform protective services course. They have been instrumental in helping the CSP to run pro-active campaigns re women's safety (hotel and taxi test purchasing) as well as knife test purchases. It is hoped that they will promote the use of the app to other students/friends.
- The 'soft' launch of the North Herts women's safety charter was held on the 21 November. Good attendance from local licensees. Guest speakers were well received.

Democratic Services

Committee Services

- Recruitment regarding the Committee, Member and Scrutiny Officer role - the job has been offered and awaiting HR process to accept formally.
- There were no applicants shortlisted for interview regarding the Scrutiny Officer role, which is now being readvertised on the Council website and via the Essex County Council job board, to widen the reach of potential applicants. Deadline for applications midday on Monday 15 January 2024.
- Arranged and held extraordinary meetings of both O&S and Cabinet in December to consider, mainly, the Waste and Recycling Contract and Leisure Contract.
- Supported Licensing through a Sub-Committee hearing on Friday 8 December.
- Continuing to prepare and promote the Chair's Civic Event and Awards on 1 March 2024. Tickets are on sale and raffle prizes being sought from local businesses.
- Working on plans for the new Civic Year, including Members Induction programme and calendar.

Electoral Services

 Concluded the annual canvass and published the revised register of

- electors for 2023-2024. Final completion rate was 97.3%.
- Following the register publication, the team is now working on the distribution of the register to the various entitled recipients, including elected members, credit reference agencies and entitled government bodies.
- The May 2024 elections have been built within our Electoral Management System and booking polling station venues and contacting staff regarding their availability to work at the elections has begun. Stock checks have been undertaken to identify any gaps in equipment which need to be addressed, plans are being finalised for room/space requirements at DCO and Royal Mail postal voting licences for the new district wards have been set up.
- The AEA Eastern region branch meeting was held last week, which included updates from DLUHC and the Electoral Commission, as well as a training session on cross boundary election arrangements which was useful with one eye on the impending UK Parliamentary General Election. To this end, we have also recently met with Central Bedfordshire council to discuss cross boundary arrangements because the new parliamentary constituency boundaries require us to work alongside them for the first time at the next election.
- We have also attended training on the implementation on the latest measures of the Elections Act 2022 – namely the changes to the overseas electors' franchise. These changes will see the removal of the 15-year rule which currently exists and will go live from January 2024.
- Finally, BID ballots for Royston (30 Nov) and Hitchin and Letchworth (7 Dec) have closed and the results have been declared.

Throughout November, we have been busy coordinating various partnership networks and events and the provision of ongoing Community and Member support.

- Attended various groups and networking opportunities including Youth Action Network and HCC

- Annual Voluntary and Community Sector conference, various school visits with Councillors and Ward Walks, attendance at the Interfaith Forum AGM, Holocaust Memorial Day preparation with NH Interfaith forum.
- Ongoing work to provide updates on the Climate Hive Engagement page – including Green Careers week and the use of thermal imaging cameras.
- Assessment of Community Investment Fun applications
- Successful support of the Remembrance Sunday event in Letchworth Garden City. Officers worked in partnership with the Letchworth BID and Royal British Legion and other groups to make sure the roads were closed, and the event proceeded without incident.
- Support of Youth Democracy Day in the Council Chamber.
- Resources support of Baldock Ecofest.
- Policy participation at the Hertfordshire Climate Change and Sustainability Partnership – presentation of countywide Bio-diversity action plan and facilitation at workshop – the event was filmed by Channel 4.

Home Upgrade Grant Phase 2 (HUG2)

Home Upgrade Grant Phase 2 is live and details can be found on our webpage. Further mailouts will follow to target areas as well as posters directed to stakeholders.

Solar Together

The second round of Solar Together has now closed for registrations as has the window for accepting offer recommendations. North Herts received a total of 897 registrations and 185 households have accepted their solar pv recommendation. The price achieved for the average 14-panel system within this scheme is 34% cheaper than the typical market price for an equivalent system. Solar Together | North Herts Council (north-herts.gov.uk)

Climate Hive Engagements

The Climate Hive now has 325 subscribers and we continue to update users with the latest climate activity such as the HUG2 launch, COP28 and use of Thermal Imaging Cameras. We encourage staff to take a look at the Hive and post their climate tips.

Public Sector Decarbonisation Scheme (PSDS)

Heat decarbonisation plans have been created for our three leisure sites. We have utilised these plans to submit an application to the Public Sector Decarbonisation Scheme for works to decarbonise our leisure facilities. We will find out the outcome of our application by mid-March. We have been notified our application is currently being assessed. Consultants have also conducted site visits of the leisure facilities to determine more details of construction, should we be successful.

EV Charging Funding

Negotiations are near finalisation with the provider for charge points as part of ORCS (On-Street Residential Chargepoint Scheme), installations are due to be complete by Autumn. We have identified potential sites for use of LEVI (Local Electric Vehicle Infrastructure) for when funds are made available.

Solar for Business

A discussion paper on Solar for Business is due to go to leadership in January, with updates to follow.

RIPA Quarterly Update

Members may recall that it was considered that quarterly reports should be made to Overview and Scrutiny Committee, even though RIPA is not currently being used, as this provided a useful mechanism to ensure that the issue of RIPA remained in the consciousness of Members (and Officers).

Due to the continued non-use of RIPA, it was felt by some members that this method of reporting was not the best use of the Overview and Scrutiny Committee's time, and following advice from the Investigatory Powers Commissioner's Office, the Council shall now be reporting on the issue of RIPA via quarterly inclusion in MIS.

There have been no further RIPA authorisations since the last MIS note in September 2023. There are currently no ongoing RIPA authorisations.

It is important that the Council continues to operate in accordance with RIPA to ensure that it is able to effectively manage its reputational risk whilst also exercising its legitimate evidence gathering powers in connection with enforcement activity.
