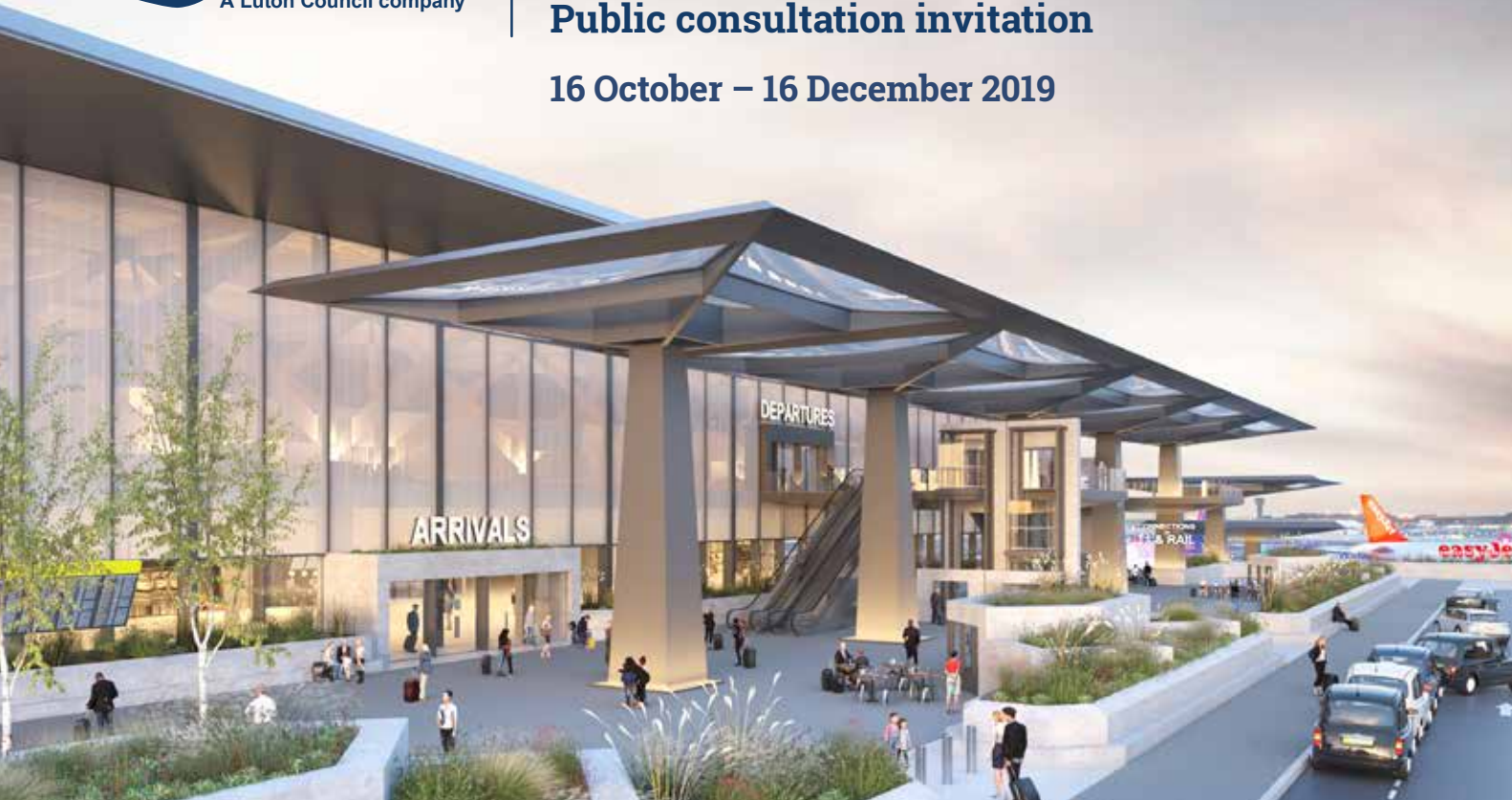

Public consultation invitation

16 October – 16 December 2019



Our consultation

We are consulting and asking for your feedback on our expansion plans to make best use of the runway at London Luton Airport.

We are London Luton Airport Ltd – the company that owns London Luton Airport.

Expanding London Luton Airport to handle up to 32 million passengers a year would bring significant benefits that would be shared locally, regionally and nationally.

We recognise that our proposals would bring impacts, for the environment and people who live and work nearby.

We are committed to minimising and mitigating these impacts and are setting out measures to tackle them, including for noise, climate change, air quality and transport.

Our consultation begins on Wednesday 16 October and ends at 11:59 pm on Monday 16 December.

Our proposed development for achieving phased airport growth to 2039 will be displayed at a series of consultation events in your area.

At the events you will have an opportunity to view the proposals, speak to members of the expert project team, and provide your feedback.

Since our first consultation held in summer 2018, we have reviewed all of the feedback provided to help develop our proposals.

We are consulting again now to show you how our plans have developed, and to hear your views.

Ensuring everyone benefits

We are proud of the benefits that London Luton Airport already brings to Luton and nearby communities, including:

- Direct employment of 9,900 jobs at the airport
- Support for around 15,600 jobs across Bedfordshire, Buckinghamshire and Hertfordshire, and 27,500 nationally
- National economic contribution of £1.8bn, including £1.1bn into the three counties and £880m for Luton

- Our own Community Funding Programme, which has already provided more than £120m over the last ten years for local charities and voluntary organisations in Luton and beyond, for the benefit of communities most impacted by airport operations

Future benefits would include:

- An increase of 5,600 direct jobs at the airport by the time it is handling 32 mppa. By this time, London Luton Airport could be supporting around 24,600 jobs across Bedfordshire, Buckinghamshire and Hertfordshire, and 43,600 nationally

- An increase of £2bn in the airport's national economic contribution by 2039, including £1.3bn more within Luton and the three counties
- A new funding package worth up to £14m a year for local authorities representing neighbouring communities most affected by airport operations
- Support in Luton for the council's clear goal to tackle poverty and improve lives

Why grow?

London Luton Airport has been one of the UK's fastest growing airports over the last eight years. It is expected to reach the limits of its existing planning approval to handle 18 million passengers per annum (mppa) by the end of 2020.

Our proposal is to build a new second terminal to the north of the runway to allow the airport to expand.

This would enable us to increase the annual capacity of the airport over time by a further

14 million passengers, bringing it up to 32 mppa. This would help meet the significant projected shortfall in UK aviation capacity.

As we grow, we want to:

- Improve choice and the customer experience for our passengers
- Deliver greater opportunity to trade for local businesses
- Enable cost-effective growth for our airlines
